1. Opening

O send out your light and your truth; let them lead me; let them bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling. (Psam 43,3)

2. Listening to the Word

□ Scripture Reading: John 12:20-33 Let

the Word sink into the deep space of your heart.

- o The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified...
- Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit...
- o And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself...



In every death, there is life. The grain of wheat will die but that death is not the end, it is the beginning of new life. One grain that dies gives life to hundreds of new grains and will through death nourish us with food. In the death of relationships, of health and all that may be dear to us, there is always the invitation to new life, to deeper life.

Rosa Dâng has been struggling with cancer over three years now. She is at the terminal phase of her illness. The physical pain is excruciating, it's stuck in her lungs, her abdomen, her back, her swollen legs. But never a complaint has been uttered, never a groan heard. And mysteriously, in the soil of this silent suffering, flourish compassion and support. I have never seen a patient surrounded with so much attentive love and tender care by Sisters, family and friends.



I myself have grown in the soil of this suffering. One day I was massaging her back. With all my gentle energy and a fervent prayer. A cry of the heart to God for her. I was not asking for anything, not knowing what to ask for... It was just a whisper of trust to God, the God of Life and Love. Prayer becomes a silence of trust, a dialogue of trusting silence between God and me.

Suffering is a catalyst for light and insights.

Rosa Dâng is like a bamboo water conduit channeling blessings of God for us. To allow the free flow of the blessings, she has to be emptied, to be shaped, to surrender... to let go so that new life can be for her and for others.

3. To be One with the Word

Life, it seems, is a natural journey from ego building, from gaining one's name and fame to ego-transcendence... This journey is an ongoing process of letting go, of dispossession, of dying toward deeper life, real life for self and others. Salt gives its taste by dissolving in water. A candle gives light by burning its wick and melting its wax.

Let's pray with the following poem:
